1. Main Panel Trail

A well defined trail that follows along the base of the mesa/terrace to view assorted petroglyphs dating from Basketmaker II period to Navajo occupation. The Navajo rock art is best-known collection of 16th-18th century Navajo petroglyphs in the American Southwest.



2. 44 Panel Trail

This trail is located at the end of the access road to a well site and heads into the canyon. Along this trail are numerous petroglyphs of Ancestral Puebloa, Navajo, and historic Hispanic.



3. Shaft House Trail

For the more adventurous, continue past the 44 Panel trail to the north fork of Crow Canyon. At the point of the canyon before it splits again, is Shaft House Pueblito located approximately ¾ of the way up slope of the mesa. The hike to the pueblito is steep and there is no defined trail.
