





## T-SHAPED DOORWAYS




T-Shaped doorways are a unique architecture style that is unique to Chaco Culture. What do you think the purpose of such doorways were?





Inside the Great Kiva. Kivas are where the ancestral Pueblo people and modern day Pueblo people have ceremonies.



Petroglyphs - Symbols pecked into stone.

Pictographs - Symbols painted onto walls or stone.


Pottery was important to ancestral Pueblo life. Food was stored and cooked in plain and corrugated pots. Painted pots and vessels were for serving food and ritual use.



Corn (maize) was a main food source for the ancestral Pueblo people.


In addition, ancestral pueblo farmers grew squash, beans,
and other crops.

## GRINDING TOOLS



This is a metate with a mano (grinding stone) inside.

These stone tools were used to grind corn.



Ancestral pueblo people did not have metal, so all their hammering and cutting tools were made from stone.
