The Dunes Off-Road Vehicle Recreation Area comprises 825 acres of large sand dunes, open flats, hillsides, and sandy and rocky arroyos. Innumerable trails cross the area, created by over 40 years of off-road vehicle use. Steep sandstone walls and rock spires border the area to the south and east. The area is open to off-road vehicles, dirt bikes, mountain bikes and hiking. The diverse landscape provides a chance for riders to play, test their endurance and improve their skills.



The Dunes ORV Recreation Area provides a variety of challenges for riders of all skill levels.

Enjoy Your Ride-Safely!

There is active oil and gas development in the Dunes. Look out for oil and gas equipment and vehicles.

- Ride with a partner
- Wear a helmet, eye protection and protective clothing
- Take plenty of water
- Pack a first aid kit
- Keep your headlight on at all times
- Don't ride impaired. Drugs, alcohol, and ORVs don't mix!
- Permits are required for all commercial, competitive, and organized group events
- Shooting is prohibited
- Make sure your vehicle is in good working condition
- Ride in compliance with all state laws and regulations
- There is no trash collection. Trash can form a danger to you and others—please pack out what you pack in.

All ATV drivers must have a valid state license or "learner's permit," and have completed a stateapproved training program. Children must be supervised by a licensed adult.
