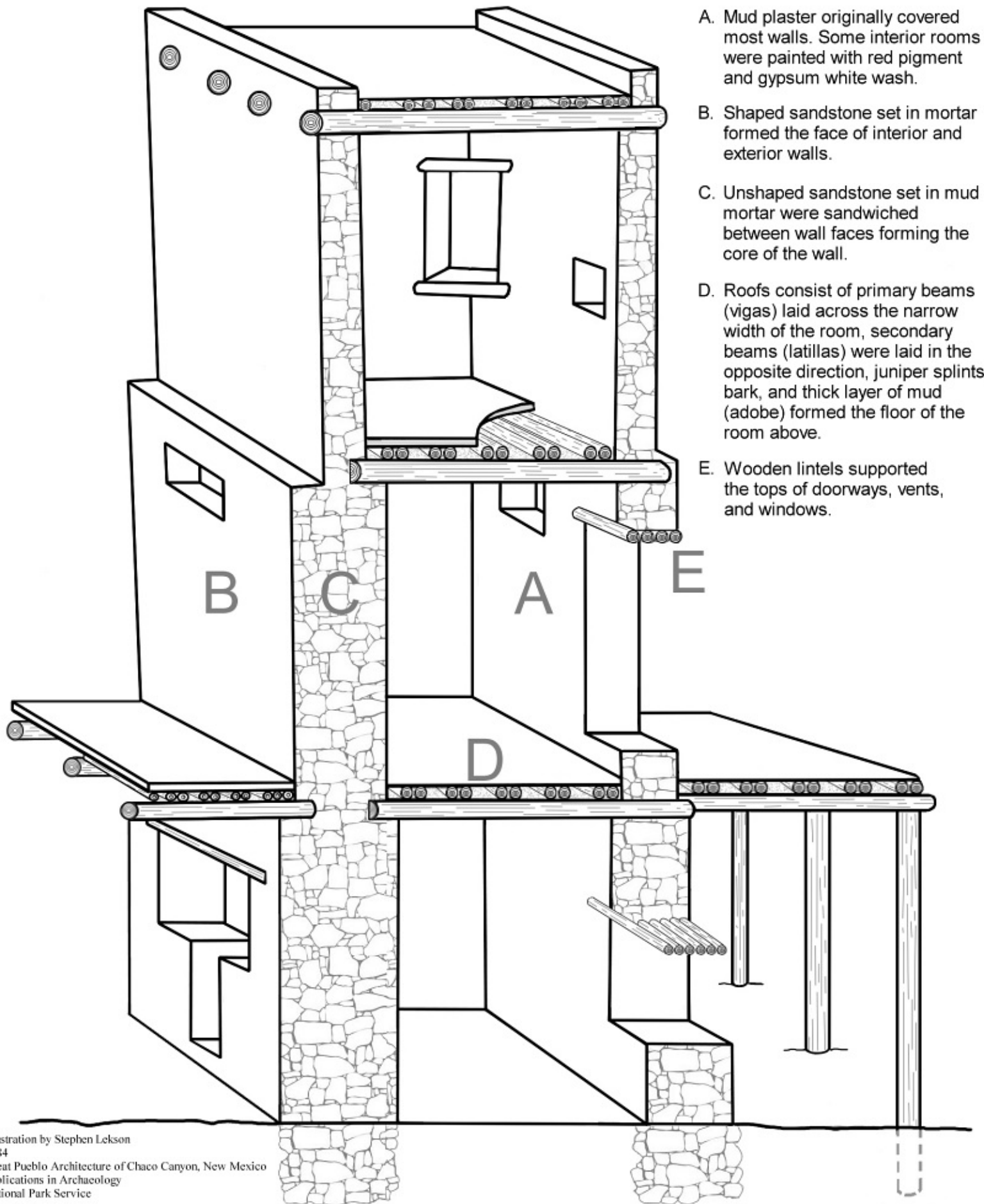


PUEBLO CONSTRUCTION



- A. Mud plaster originally covered most walls. Some interior rooms were painted with red pigment and gypsum white wash.
- B. Shaped sandstone set in mortar formed the face of interior and exterior walls.
- C. Unshaped sandstone set in mud mortar were sandwiched between wall faces forming the core of the wall.
- D. Roofs consist of primary beams (vigas) laid across the narrow width of the room, secondary beams (latillas) were laid in the opposite direction, juniper splints, bark, and thick layer of mud (adobe) formed the floor of the room above.
- E. Wooden lintels supported the tops of doorways, vents, and windows.
